
#### **Academic Challenge**


- Increased depth of knowledge and understanding

- Attend all lesson

- Complete classwork and homework tasks to an appropriate standard
- 15 hours a week outside lesson time
- Always work to do (in addition to homework):
  - Read appropriate sections of textbooks
  - –Read around the subject
  - Supplement their notes from lessons
  - Use libraries and watch suitable and relevant TV programmes as well as reading quality, broadsheet newspapers
  - -Identify weaker areas and take positive steps to conquer them
  - -Revise as they go along; make note summaries, flash card, mind maps
  - Look at past examination papers to see how questions relate to the topics they're learning
