An education based on 'excellence for all' empowers young people to change the(ir) future, shape society and the benefit the wider community/world.

## Subject Curriculum

A challenging and aspirational A-level or BTEC curriculum which provides a full-time programme of study reflecting individual starting points & needs

Subjects will provide:

- Subject 'handbook' setting out: expectations e.g. folder organisation, homework, sources of information and support, links to specifications, practice papers, revision guides, reading lists, relevant websites and required equipment
- ✓ <u>Subject curriculum maps</u>
- ✓ Subject tracking TAG/Alps data, in class assessments and mock grades shared (three formalised mock weeks during KS5)
- ✓ Regular checking of subject folders / books
- Challenging homework set at least weekly (on Go4schools) and checked / assessed e.g. through feedback, class discussion, use in lesson activities
- ✓ Lessons and learning activities with clear purpose and explicit next steps
- Consistent and explicit expectations of behaviours in and beyond the classroom linked to our policy and ethos
- Planned subject intervention (contracts of study) - reviewed following each reporting cycle to support and/or challenge targeted students
- Subject challenge strategy to develop and challenge high performing students/MAT

## Super-Curricular

An offer that inspires a love of learning and engages students in ideas that go beyond a core exam specification

- Super-Curricular reading and activities, via Padlet which are focused on providing subject stretch and challenge (including undergraduate level wider reading)
- ✓ At least one guest speaker/trip per subject linked to employment and progression
- ✓ Opportunities to take part in subject specific competitions such as STEM Awards, the Maths challenges, young enterprise etc.

## Curriculum 'Extension'/Additional Studies

An offer that enables students to compliment their core subject learning

- ✓ <u>Additional studies</u> EPQ; IPQ; Core Maths
- ✓ Offering x4 A-levels
  - o For students with 5x Grade 7
  - For those that wish to trial an additional subject to aid appropriate choices
- ✓ English/Maths GCSE re-sit
- A programme of guest speakers to support the delivery of Careers Information, Advice and Guidance (CIAG); progression; raising aspirations and the understanding of contemporary issues

Personal Development, Enrichment, Clubs and Societies (Extra-Curricular)

A wide curriculum, which ensures students from CSF leave having gained high quality experiences, develop their skills and character.

- ✓ Timetabled programme of <u>Personal Development</u>, assemblies and tutor periods to develop wider skills and prepare for the future (<u>Careers</u>)
- ✓ Timetabled weekly <u>Enrichment</u> where students access activities on a Wednesday afternoon
- ✓ Extra-Curricular programme that students are encouraged to take part in and potentially lead (e.g. recreational sport; music; drama productions; Gold DofE; clubs and societies)
- ✓ Work Experience all Year 12 students complete a minimum of one week of <u>WEX</u> in 'futures week'
- ✓ Student leadership Council; subject ambassadors and mental health ambassadors

Students will be encouraged to set up additional groups to match their interests

## In addition, CSF will provide:

- Aspirational targets set via ALPs: students understand where these come from and how progress will be tracked
- ✓ Induction programme for all which includes summer precourse projects / work
- ✓ A challenging, engaging and aspirational curriculum plan / map which prepares students for more than just exams
- Dedicated lesson time for the development and assessment of subject specific and wider skills e.g. oracy, literacy, practical, consolidation and exam technique(s)
- ✓ Regular, rigorous assessment and feedback with opportunities for students to respond
- Assessment data which informs progress tracking, intervention, continuous improvement, target setting and support
- ✓ Students with autonomy, through opportunities for extended independent work, with the space and encouragement to improve their work e.g. through drafting/redrafting and skills, and the time to deepen their knowledge of key concepts
- $\checkmark$  Academic tutors to provide regular academic coaching
- ✓ <u>Pastoral, SEND</u> and <u>wellbeing</u> support
- ✓ Opportunities for parental contact: subject/tutor evenings and contact, progression events, and regular reporting on progress and attendance (weekly)
- ✓ UCAS / Apprenticeship / Employment progression support for all (including two off-timetable progression support days)
- ✓ UCAS Early entry / MAT programme (with University of Cambridge/Oxford visits if required)
- ✓ 1:1 CIAG advice and guidance interview(s) for <u>all</u>
- $\checkmark~$  Organised visits to at least one university and a FE / HE / UCAS Discovery Day
- ✓ Range of guest speakers from employers, HE providers, Alumni
