Choosing the right course - learning and assessing

At university you will learn in new and different ways than you have before, for example:

- Lectures large classes with experts presenting
- Seminars small sessions with your peers
- Practical putting theory into practice
- Independent study master your own schedule and study time

You will also be assessed in ways you may not have been before, for example:

dissertations, essays, portfolios, presentations, observations, exams, demonstrations, projects, coursework, case studies, participation, placements, research reports or proposals...

2. Use UCAS to search courses



- What does the course cover?
- Courses with the same title may be very different.
- Look carefully at the core course content, and the range of optional studies/modules available.
- Which modules are the most interesting and relevant to your career aspirations?
- See if the course or university/college offers any internship, placement, or study abroad opportunities.
- How is the course taught structured teaching, or more independent research? How many lectures are there, and how much group work will be done in seminars?
- How is the course assessed?





3. Attend open days

Benefits of attending open days:

- Get a feel for the university
- Meet academic staff to ask them questions about the course
- See the teaching facilities
- Check out accommodation options
- Understand the length and ease of the journey from home to university
- Speak to current students at the university and hear about their experiences
- Meet other potential students
- Experience the facilities a university has to offer for extracurricular – e.g. sports, music...
- Receive advice about your application

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

4. Pick 5 university choices

You can add a maximum of 5 university choices on your UCAS application.

It is important to choose the university and courses you will be applying for before you write your personal statement.

This means you will be able to do your research into the course and make sure that your application is well suited to it.

You <u>do not</u> have to put 5 choices into your application all at once. If you are unsure or want to wait to see what offers you receive, you can add courses later to your application.



As you add information to each tile, the percentage complete updates each time you mark a section as complete.

You don't need to complete the application straight away; you can log in and out at any time until you're finished.





2026 Personal Statement

3 sections with question prompts:

1. Why do you want to study this course or subject?

This is your opportunity to showcase your passion and knowledge of your chosen subject area and to demonstrate to universities and colleges why they are a good fit for you and your future ambitions.

This is your chance to shout about the relevant or transferable skills you've gained from your education and highlight your understanding of how they will help you succeed in this subject area.

3. What else have you done to prepare outside of education, and why are these experiences useful?


This is your chance to reflect on any other activities you have undertaken outside of your education, or personal experiences which further demonstrate your suitability for the course. This section is likely to be deeply personal to you, so anything you include should be meaningful and relevant to you.



- Show mature academic motivation
- Mention specific aspects of interest -
- Write clearly PEEL -
- Write several drafts
- Read through with teachers/ advisers
- Check spelling and grammar


The tuition fee loan (currently 9,535 per year) covers the cost of your course and is paid directly to the university you end up going to. It isn't paid to you – you won't see this money until you have graduated and are potentially paying it back.

Maintenance Loan



The maintenance loan is the money you get to help you with your living costs. Unlike the tuition fee loan, every student will get a different amount of maintenance loan, as the amount you get will depend on your household income, as well as where you live and study while you're a student.

Other options:


<u>Extra (26 Feb – 4 Jul)</u>

- Add Extra choices for consideration one at a time.


<u>Clearing (5 Jul – Oct)</u>

- Apply after 30 June, receive no offers, decline all offers, not met conditions.
- Find vacancies from 5 July and add a Clearing choice to your application.

Key facts for your application







Start your application from 13 May 2025

Universities and colleges can't see your other choices when you apply.

Apply by the equal consideration date. (14 Jan 2026)



Five choices, unless applying to study medicine, veterinary, medicine/scienc e, dentistry – then it's **four** choices.

You can't apply to both Oxford and Cambridge.

Applying costs £28.50.






